THE PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF COMMUNITY AWARDS PROGRAM

*Since 1995, recognizing young people
for outstanding volunteer service*

WHAT ARE THE PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF COMMUNITY AWARDS?

The Prudential Spirit of Community Awards were created in 1995 to recognize students in middle and high school grades who have made meaningful contributions to their communities through volunteer service. These prestigious awards, sponsored by Prudential Financial in partnership with the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP), are presented annually on the local, state and national level.

HOW DOES THE PROGRAM WORK?

1. Young volunteers in grades 5-12 complete applications online at <http://spirit.prudential.com> or www.nassp.org/spirit by November 3, 2015, and then submit them to their school principals or to the head of one of these officially designated local organizations: a Girl Scout council, county 4-H organization, American Red Cross chapter, YMCA, or affiliate of HandsOn Network. Applicants and their parents also must complete the application form's signature page.



2. Each participating school or organization reviews the applications of its students and selects one middle level Local Honoree for every 1,000 students in grades 5-8, and/or one high school Local Honoree for every 1,000 students in grades 9-12.
3. Principals or organization heads certify applications of their selected Local Honoree(s) online by November 10, 2015.
4. The top middle level and high school youth volunteer in each state and the District of Columbia are named State Honorees in February, and two to 10 runners-up in each state are named Distinguished Finalists.
5. Ten of the State Honorees are named America's top 10 youth volunteers of the year by a distinguished national selection committee at a special ceremony in Washington, D.C., in May.

WHAT DO HONOREES RECEIVE?

- Local Honorees receive Certificates of Achievement from their schools or organizations. Those who qualify also receive the President's Volunteer Service Award.
- State Honorees receive \$1,000, engraved silver medallions, and an all-expense-paid trip with a parent or guardian to Washington, D.C., in May for several days of recognition events, including award ceremonies, sightseeing tours and Congressional visits on Capitol Hill.
- Distinguished Finalists (runners-up at the state level) receive engraved bronze medallions.
- Other top applicants at the state level receive Certificates of Excellence.
- National Honorees receive additional \$5,000 awards, engraved gold medallions, and crystal trophies for their schools or organizations. They also receive \$5,000 grants from The Prudential Foundation for nonprofit charitable organizations of their choice.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Any student who:

- is in grades 5-12 as of November 3, 2015, and is a legal resident of one of the 50 states of the United States or the District of Columbia
- has engaged in a volunteer activity that occurred at least in part after September 1, 2014
- completes an application and submits it to a school principal or the head of an officially designated local organization by November 3, 2015.

Online application form is available at <http://spirit.prudential.com> and www.nassp.org/spirit. Program information is mailed to all middle level and high schools and to officially designated local organizations (see below).

November 3, 2015

Deadline for students to complete applications online, submit applications to a school principal or the head of an officially designated local organization, and send in signed signature page.

November 4-10, 2015

Participating schools and organizations review applications and select Local Honorees, then nominate them for state-level judging by certifying their applications online.

February 9, 2016

Judges name the top middle level and high school youth volunteer in every state and the District of Columbia as State Honorees.

April 30 - May 3, 2016

102 State Honorees attend national recognition events in Washington, D.C., where America's top 10 youth volunteers of the year are announced.

Applicants must submit completed applications to one of the following:

- A middle level or high school
- A Girl Scout council
- A county 4-H organization
- An American Red Cross chapter
- A YMCA
- An affiliate of HandsOn Network

HOW TO APPLY FOR A PRUDENTIAL SPIRIT OF COMMUNITY AWARD

Apply for a 2016 Prudential Spirit of Community Award and you could win \$1,000 and a trip to Washington, D.C., next May!

- Go to <http://spirit.prudential.com> or www.nassp.org/spirit to access the online application.
- Complete the application and the student/parent agreement. Deadline: November 3, 2015.
- Go to the "Certification" page to email or print out instructions for your certifier. You must deliver these instructions to your certifier by November 3, 2015. Your certifier can be your school principal or the head of a county 4-H organization, Girl Scout council, American Red Cross chapter, YMCA or HandsOn Network affiliate.
- Your certifier has until November 10, 2015 to review applications online and select Local Honoree(s) from the applicants in your school or organization, and nominate them for state-level judging.

In each state and Washington, D.C., the top middle level and high school applicant will be named State Honorees and will receive an award of \$1,000, an engraved silver medallion, and an all-expense-paid trip with a parent or guardian to Washington, D.C., April 30 - May 3, 2016. Runners-up will also be selected in each state and named Distinguished Finalists, receiving a bronze medallion. Other state-level winners will receive Certificates of Excellence. All state-level honorees will be announced in February.



During the trip, 10 of the State Honorees will be named America's top youth volunteers of the year. These National Honorees will receive \$5,000 awards, engraved gold medallions, crystal trophies for their schools or organizations, and \$5,000 grants from The Prudential Foundation for nonprofit charitable organizations of their choice.

All Local Honorees who have committed a minimum number of hours to their volunteer activities will receive the President's Volunteer Service Award.
